The Cuban Missile Crisis

This revision activity works best if you do it with a friend, and talk about it as you do it.

Print off and cut out the cards below.

Select the six most important events and place them against the correct date on the timeline.

Explain HOW they turned out to be important – what were the consequences.

Finally, using all the event cards, practise placing the events next to the correct dates.

January 1961 ↓	Kennedy becomes US president. He immediately breaks off diplomatic relations with Cuba.
April 1961 ↓	A CIA-funded invasion at the Bay of Pigs is defeated.
June 1961	At the Vienna summit, Khrushchev orders Kennedy to get out of West Berlin.
August 1961	The Russians build the Berlin Wall, taking the USA by surprise.
September 1961	Khrushchev starts sending weapons to Cuba.
November 1961	Kennedy authorises Operation Mongoose, including attempts to assassinate Castro.
14 October 1962 ↓	A US spy-plane discovers ICBM launch pads in Cuba, starting the Cuban Missile Crisis .
22 October 1962 ↓	Kennedy announces a naval blockade.
25 October 1962	Russian ships reach the blockade but turn back.
26 October 1962 ↓	Khrushchev offers to dismantle the bases if Kennedy promises not to invade. Kennedy agrees.
27 October 1962 ↓	Khrushchev tells Kennedy to dismantle US missile bases in Turkey. Kennedy agrees as long as it remains secret.
28 October 1962	Khrushchev accepts Kennedy's offer; the Cuban Missile Crisis ends .
