3. Subordinating conjunctions I – because

A subordinating conjunction joins two sentences together, so that the resultant sentence is more interesting, and carries more information.

One of the most important subordinating conjunctions for historians is 'because'.

'Because' is essential in any answer which requires you to 'explain', thus:

consequence ←	BECAUSE	← cause
---------------	----------------	---------

eg.:

“Germany was badly governed **because** the Kaiser was a disaster.”
